Monday Mission: Whatever You Do

Colossians 3:23-24 NIV

Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving.

This verse tells us to work at whatever we do with all our hearts. The Greek definition of “heart” (kardia) is stated to be the center of our being. It is the place where our desires and decisions originate. In ancient Greek culture, the heart was believed to be the place where God communicates with humans, and where faith and understanding are held.

Matthew 22: 37 says, “You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind.”

Loving God is obeying and serving Him.

Ask yourself: Is God the center of my work? Is He the center of my Life?

Pray that we, the Church, live and work as if He is the center of everything.

Thanksgiving Tuesday

Then he went with them into the temple courts, walking and jumping, and praising God.

We have been given a much greater gift than just a physical healing. Jesus gave up his life for us so we could be free from the bondage of sin and death. We have been adopted as sons and daughters of the Almighty God, and made royal priests that will rule as co-heirs with Jesus Christ! This is a gift worthy of uninhibited praise to God!

Take time to worship Him and give thanks for the freedom He has freely given to you.

World Wednesday -

Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful. And pray for us, too, that God may open a door for our message, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ, for which I am in chains. Pray that I may proclaim it clearly, as I should. Be wise in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity.
