God's word calls us to trust him, even when troublesome things occur. And my guess is that we here at New Heights don't have much trouble agreeing with that, for the most part, anyway. It's not that we don't trust him, sometimes, though, I think if we're honest, it can be difficult to know how to display that trust. This week's key scripture from the sermon: Revelation 21: 1-7

Take time each day to:

- **Read The Word**
 - Pick a passage to focus on for the day.
- **Meditate on The Word**
 - Read the passage slowly and repeatedly.
 - Allow your heart to be moved and guided by the Spirit as you engage with the scripture.
 - Use these reflections as a bridge. Connect your study of the Word with your prayers, allowing your thoughts and insights to deepen your conversation with the Lord.
- **PRAY - Praise, Repent, Ask, Yield**

Read The Word - Revelation 21:5

Meditate on The Word:

This world is broken, dark and falling apart. But Jesus...

Our lives can seem broken, hopeless and feel like they are falling apart. But Jesus is making all things new!

We don't have to live in the broken. We don't have to live in the hopeless. We don't have to live in the darkness, because we live in the Light, when we walk with Jesus. When we accept Jesus as our Savior, He makes us new. He promises to make everything new. He is working on it in His timing, and in His way. We can't forget that.

When he makes us new, Jesus puts His light in us. It becomes a part of us. We shine because of His light! We are supposed to live our lives like a city on a hill, shining for all to see.
